- A. The Start Smart program is aimed at helping newly licensed – or soon to be licensed-teenage drivers (15-19) become more aware of the responsibilities that accompany the privilege of being a licensed California driver.
- B. Start Smart trainings are highly impactful interactive traffic safety classes for drivers or soon to be drivers 15 to 19 years of age and their parents.
- C. Participants who complete the program receive a certification and the potential to have their insurance rate reduced.
- D. Start Smart will soon start hosting trainings for the San Rafael City Schools community (so far the teen driving safety classes have been well attended by the Tam Unified School District because of their close proximity to the CHP Corte Madera building).

A. Juvenile Hall Updates

1. Major concerns from juvenile justice commission inspection conducted on January 12th, 2023, 1) staff using non-binary gender identify/preferred pronouns 2) youth reporting being unable to have video visitation with their families 3) youth reported receiving point deduction for opting out of drug and alcohol recovery meetings.
2. There are 14 youth in juvenile hall: 12 boys & 2 girls. The total number of youths was as high as 23 a few days ago.
