ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER RE:
IMPLEMENTATION OF ADDITIONAL
EMERGENCY RELIEF AUTHORIZED
PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE
SECTION 68115 AND OTHER ORDERS
BY CHAIR OF JUDICIAL COUNCIL

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, on March 16, 2020, March 17, 2020, April 1, 2020, April 28, 2020, May 26, 2020, June 19, 2020, July 20, 2020, August 18, 2020, September 17, 2020, October 15, 2020, November 13, 2020, December 11, 2020, January 8, 2021, February 8, 2021, March 8, 2021, April 2, 2021, and January 6, 2022, the Court issued Administrative Orders 20-04, 20-05, 20-06, 20-07, 20-08, 20-09, 20-10, 20-11, 20-14, 20-15, 20-16, and 20-17, 20-19, 21-01, 21-02, 21-03, and 22-01. Since those orders were issued, the pandemic has continued and we continue to deal with the effects of the Omicron Variant in our County.


The President of the United States, the Governor of California, the California Judicial Council and the Chief Justice have all issued orders that recognize the continued need to protect the health and safety of the public and court personnel. In addition, the Judicial Council passed temporary Emergency Rules related to the Covid-19 pandemic. Pursuant to: the authority granted under Government Code section 68115, issued in response to the renewed request for an emergency order

1 made by the Superior Court of Marin County (“Court”); the February 3, 2022 Order (“Order”) of
2 Chief Justice Tani G. Cantil-Sakauye, Chair of the Judicial Council of California; and based on the
3 Court’s inherent authority to control its own calendars and the Presiding Judge’s duty to take into
4 account the needs and safety of the public and the Court as they relate to the efficient and effective
5 management of the Court’s calendar (California Rules of Court, rule 10.603(c)), this Court HEREBY
6 FINDS AND ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

- 7 1. This Administrative Order 22-02 supplements Administrative Orders 22-01, 21-03, 21-02, 21-
8 01, 20-19, 20-17, 20-16, 20-15, 20-14, 20-11, 20-10, 20-09, 20-08, 20-07, 20-06, 20-05, and
9 20-04. Except as specifically modified herein, Administrative Orders 22-01, 21-03, 21-02, 21-
10 01, 20-19, 20-17, 20-16, 20-15, 20-14, 20-11, 20-10, 20-09, 20-08, 20-07, 20-06, 20-05, and
11 20-04 remain in full force and effect;
- 12 2. Court sessions may be held anywhere in the county, including in correctional and juvenile
13 detention facilities, from February 5, 2022, to March 6, 2022, inclusive (Gov. Code
14 §68115(a)(1));
- 15 3. Any judge of the Court may extend the period provided in section 1382 of the Penal Code for
16 the holding of a criminal trial by not more than 30 days, applicable only to cases in which the
17 initial or previously extended statutory deadline otherwise would expire from February 5,
18 2022 to March 6, 2022, inclusive (Gov. Code, §68115(a)(10); Executive Order N-38-20 (03-
19 27-20));
